Our trip itinerary:
We praise God for miraculous

We praise God for miraculous travel, especially navigating border issues. Our Saturday and Sunday dance workshops saw our bursary students lead dance sessions (ballet, hip hop, jazz, etc.) for local children (ages 6-12). They learned combinations and presented them in a showcase for their parents. During the **evening ministry** session, we shared our identity **curriculum**. helping the children experience God's love and understand their "seat at His table" and the Holy Spirit as their Helper. Their highlighted takeaways were God's love and presence. The final workshop day included praise, dance, and a Q&A, culminating in a showcase and a dance ministry production depicting God as our Father and King, inspiring parents to reflect on their identity as children of the King of Kings. After, we enjoyed a creative debrief and games night.

Our trip itinerary continued:

On Monday, we visited a pre-school in **Mbabane**, where one of the King's own sons were present. We celebrated Jesus as King with them and lead ballet and hip-hop workshops, filled with the children's contagious joy. A **deeply moving afternoon** was spent at Heart for Africa, a ministry caring for over 400 orphaned children, where we witnessed heaven on earth as the most vulnerable were empowered. We hope to return to do a similar workshop with these kids and to also potentially build a long-term relationship with the studio we visited to help their teacher achieve her Dance Teaching Certification to further legitimise their training.



Eswatini Trip, The Impact

This trip profoundly redefined ministry for us, shifting from organized plans to being present and adaptable. God did deep work in our ministry & management team, proving faithful through every challenge. Our unity deepened, and we embraced the concept of "Dance Families" redeeming Africa, aiming to incorporate more outreach departments from our organization in the future.

The Kingdom impact was clear: Exulting God as King and Father, seeds planted in children through our identity curriculum, and a tangible understanding that we have access to the King of Kings. We also sowed financially into the local community, demonstrating God's love, and saw dance powerfully serve in building His Kingdom.



God's Work Within Our Team

God stirred our faith, providing a template for our vision and showing dance's proper place in our organisation. We learned we are first and foremost a ministry. We also saw a significant impact on our bursary students, who describe the trip as 'life-changing' and a 'divine appointment', that helped them grow in the way they respond to God like children, or simply increasing their love for children and missions, or seeing the positive impact dance can have on people.

We saw them grow significantly in taking initiative to simply serve joyfully as and when needed. We also experienced the supernatural power of prayer, feeling carried by our community, and encouraged by hearing God's voice beforehand about specific details of the trip.

We are so incredibly grateful for everyone who donated, supported our fundraising initiatives or made their vehicles or equipment available for this transformative journey. We know and trust that the seeds planted, lives touched, and lessons learned will continue to bear fruit.

Serving the Eswatini community was a true honour, but more than that, it was a divine appointment. The outreach brought so many revelations some that I didn't even know I needed. From the moment we arrived, I found myself deeply missing my mom, whom I lost in October. 
